- 27% of the Bible deals with prophecy.

- There are 111 prophecies in the book of Isaiah
- Isaiah 42:1-9
- Isaiah 49:1-13
- Isaiah 50:4-11
- Isaiah 52:13-53:12

# The Prophecies of the Two Advents



- **THE FULFILLMENT OF THE PROPHECIES THAT RELATE TO HIS FIRST ADVENT**
- (42:9) Behold, the former things are come to pass,
- **ENCOURAGES FAITH IN HIS SECOND ADVENT!**
- and new things do I declare:
- before they spring forth I tell you of them.

# The Third Servant Song – Isaiah 50:4-11



**(50:10) Who is among you that feareth the LORD, that obeyeth the voice of his servant,**

- 1) “my servant **Isaiah**” – Isaiah 20:3
- 2) “my servant **Eliakim**” – Isaiah 22:20
- 3) “my servant **David’s** sake” – Isaiah 37:35
- 4) “But thou, **Israel**, art my servant” – Isaiah 41:8
- 5) “The voice of his servant” (**Jesus Christ**) – Isaiah 50:10

# Isaiah 50:6 – Fulfilled at Christ's First Advent



- Matthew 27:26, Then released he Barabbas unto them, **and when he had scourged Jesus**, he delivered him to be crucified. (Mark 15:15; John 19:1)
- Matthew 26:67, Then did **they spit in his face**, and buffeted him; and others smote him with the palms of their hands. (They mocked Him as a prophet)
- Matthew 27:30, And **they spit upon him**, and took the reed, and smote him on the head. (They mocked Him as a king.)
- Numbers 12:14, Deuteronomy 25:9 and Job 30:10 illustrate the gross insult of spitting upon a person.

# The Fourth Servant Song – Isaiah 52:13-53:12



- **(52:13) Behold, my servant shall deal prudently, he shall be exalted and extolled, and be very high.**
- **FULFILLED AT HIS RESURRECTION, HIS ASCENSION, HIS PRESENT SESSION AT THE RIGHT HAND OF GOD, AT HIS SECOND COMING, DURING THE MILLENNIUM AND FOR ALL OF ETERNITY!**

# Isaiah 52:14 – Fulfilled at Christ’s First Advent



- Isaiah 52:14, As many as were astonished at thee; his visage was so marred more than any man, and his form more than the sons of men.
- “he had scourged Jesus” – Matthew 27:26
- “a crown of thorns, they put it upon his head” – Matthew 27:29
- “and took the reed, and smote him on the head” – Matthew 27:30

# Isaiah 53:1 – Fulfilled at Christ's First Advent



- **(53:1) Who hath believed our report? And to whom is the arm of the Lord revealed?**
- John 12:37-38, But though he had done so many miracles before them, yet they believed not on him: That the saying of Esaias the prophet might be fulfilled, which he spake, Lord, who hath believed our report? And to whom hath the arm of the Lord been revealed?
- Romans 10:16, But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Esaias saith, Lord, who hath believed our report?

# Isaiah 53:4 – Fulfilled at Christ's First Advent



- **(53:4) Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.**
- Matthew 8:17, That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Himself took our infirmities, and bare our sicknesses.

# Isaiah 53:6 – Fulfilled at His First Advent



- **(53:6) All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.**
- I Peter 2:24-25, Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed. For ye were as sheep going astray; but are now returned unto the Shepherd and Bishop of your souls.

# Isaiah 53:7 – Fulfilled at His First Advent



- **(53:7) He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth.**
- Matthew 27:12-14, And when he was accused of he chief priests and elders, he answered nothing. Then said Pilate unto him, Hearest thou not how many things they witness against thee? And he answered him to never a word; insomuch that the governor marvelled greatly.

# ISAIAH 53 – THE SERVANT IS JESUS CHRIST



- Acts 8:32 – The Ethiopian Eunuch was reading from Isaiah 53.
- Acts 8:34, And the eunuch answered Philip, and said, I pray thee, of whom speaketh the prophet this? Of himself, or of some other man?
- Acts 8:35, Then Philip opened his mouth, and began at the same scripture (Isaiah 53) and preached unto him Jesus.

# Isaiah 53:9 – Fulfilled at Christ's First Advent



- **(53:9) And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither *was any* deceit in his mouth.**
- Luke 23:32-33, And there were also two other, **malefactors**, led with him to be put to death. And when they were come to the place, which is called Calvary, there they crucified him, and the malefactors, one on the right hand, and the other on the left.
- Matthew 27:57, When the even was come, there came **a rich man** of Arimathaea, named Joseph, who also himself was Jesus' disciple:
- Matthew 27:60, **And laid it** (the body of Jesus) **in his own new tomb**, which he had hewn out in the rock, and he rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed.

## Isaiah 53:9 – Fulfilled at Christ’s First Advent



- **(53:9) And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither *was any* deceit in his mouth.**
- I Peter 2:22-23, Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth: Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously.

# Isaiah 53:12 – Fulfilled at Christ’s First Coming



- **(53:12) . . . because he hath poured out his soul unto death; and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.**
- Mark 15:27-28, And with him they crucify two thieves; the one on his right hand, and the other on his left. And the scripture was fulfilled, which saith, And he was numbered with the transgressors. (Luke 22:37)
- Hebrews 9:28, So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation. (Two Advents)

# Isaiah 53:12 – Is Being Fulfilled Presently



- **(53:12) . . . and made intercession for the transgressors.**
- Romans 8:34, Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, **who also maketh intercession for us.**
- Hebrews 7:25, Wherefore he is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth **to make intercession for them.**
- I John 2:1, . . . And if any man sin, **we have an advocate** with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.

# Isaiah 53:12 – Is Fulfilled at His Second Advent



- **(53:12) Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong;**
- Revelation 19:14, And the armies which were in heaven followed him upon white horses, clothed in fine linen, white and clean.
- Revelation 20:6, Blessed and holy is he that **hath part** in the first resurrection: on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with him a thousand years.

# “Ye Must Be Born Again” – John 3:7



- **Born twice – Die once = Part of 1<sup>st</sup> Resurrection**
  - Physical Birth – Date of birth \_\_\_\_\_
  - Spiritual Birth – Date of new birth ??????????????
  - First Resurrection – Three phases
    - ✦ At the Rapture – the Bride of Christ, the Church
    - ✦ At the Revelation – OT Israel and the Tribulation Martyrs
    - ✦ At the end of the Millennium – Millennial Saints
  
- **Born once – Die twice = Part of 2<sup>nd</sup> Death**
  - Physical Birth – Date of birth \_\_\_\_\_
  - Spiritual Death – cast into hell at death ??????????????
  - Great White Throne – 2<sup>nd</sup> Resurrection = Sinners cast into the lake of fire (Physical and Spiritual Death) “This is the second death” (Revelation 20:14).

# THE ETERNAL CHOICE: To Trust the Lord



- (50:10) Who *is* among you **that feareth** the LORD, **that obeyeth** the voice of his servant, that walketh *in* darkness, and hath no light? **let him trust** in the name of the LORD, **and stay** upon his God.
- “stay” – means “rely, lean, rest”

# OR TO CHOOSE TO TRUST YOURSELF



- (50:11) Behold, all **ye that kindle** a fire, **that compass yourselves about** with sparks: walk in the light of **your fire**, and in the sparks *that ye have kindled*. This shall ye have of mine hand; ye shall lie down in sorrow.
- “Sorrow” – means “torment.”
- Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding” (Proverbs 3:5).

# TRUST IN THE LORD TO SAVE YOU



- Dear Lord:
- Today, I choose to rely fully upon You to save me. I will lean on Your Word and trust You alone for salvation. I am going to trust Christ's payment for my sins to release me from the punishment I deserve. By faith, I now call upon You to receive the gift of eternal life. - **(50:4) The Lord GOD hath given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to *him that is weary*: he wakeneth morning by morning, he wakeneth mine ear to hear as the learned.**
